### **Advanced course**

#### 1. In-class lesson

The focus of the course will be on showing one's vision of Rome through the places visited in the city. The background of the students and their knowledge of photography will be tested both technically and theoretically through the selection of shots proposed by each of them. The technical tools used, from cameras to post-production software, will be examined. Introduction of the basic notions: exposure, depth of field and composition, analysis of case histories

### 2. Outdoor lessons

A tour of Piazza Navona. Historical and artistic overview of the place. Recap of theoretical and technical notions and focus on composition.

#### 3. In-class lesson

A review of the photos. A selection of the best works (taking into consideration the draft caption and title for each picture). Post-production of the selected photos.

### 4. Outdoor lessons

Visit to the Colosseum Park. Visit of the Palatine Hill and the Roman Forum. Entry to the Colosseum. Historical and artistic introduction to the place. Recap of theoretical and technical notions and focus on composition.

### 5. In-class lesson

A review of the photos. A selection of the best works (considering the draft caption and title for each picture). Post-production of the selected photos.

### 6. Outdoor lessons

Walk through the Ghetto and Tiber Island. Historical and artistic overview of the area. Visit to the basement of the Basilica of San Bartolomeo all'Isola. Walk along the riverbanks of the island and through the heart of the Ghetto, Portico di Ottavia, Piazza delle Cinque Scolae and the Fountain of the Turtles. In-depth analysis of the notions acquired in the previous lessons. Lunch in a typical restaurant to discover the Roman gastronomic tradition and Roman-Jewish cuisine

### 7. In-class lesson

A review of the photos. A selection of the best works (taking into consideration the draft caption and title for each picture). Post-production of the selected photos.

### 8. Outdoor lessons


Visit to the National Roman Museum of Palazzo Massimo alle Terme. Exploration of the artworks in the Museum. Familiarity with shooting techniques with artificial light and with the problems of shooting in an interior/in an internal area.

### 9. Outdoor lessons

Check of the output shots and selection with post-production. Finalization of the project.
